ASA PA DISTRICT 6 PLAYER EJECTION POLICY

As in the past, the number one goal in District 6 during 1999 is to create and promote a family atmosphere at all ASA functions. An emphasis on Playing Rule 10, Section 9A and the following policy will be used to achieve this goal.

Playing Rule 10, Section 9A states "Players, coaches, managers or other team members will not make disparaging or insulting remarks to or about opposing players, officials or spectators or commit other acts (e.g. profane or abusive language, taunting ...) that could be considered unsportsman-like conduct.

Any player, manager or coach who participates in an ASA sanctioned league, tournament or playoff game will be governed by the following ASA District 6 Ejection Policy. This policy is for all District 6 participants:

If any of the aforementioned is ejected from a game, he/she will not be permitted to participate in the league or tournament in which the ejection occurred for one (1) game after the initial infraction. The second infraction will result in a suspension of two (2) games. The two game suspension will take place in the league or tournament of the second ejection. The third ejection will result in a suspension from all ASA participation for one (1) year from the date of the third infraction. The ejection policy will be cumulative throughout all ASA participation during the calendar year.

EXAMPLE: If your first ejection is in the Marcus Hook Slow Pitch League, you will sit one (1) game in that league. If your second ejection is in the Millennium League you will not participate in the Millennium League for the next two (2) games. The third ejection for the year will result in that player, manager, coach or team representative to be suspended from all ASA sanctioned play, for one (1) year from the date of the third ejection.

ALL ejections will be reported by the umpire to the assignor who will report the incident to the league commissioner and Umpire In Chief or designee within 24 hours. Written reports should follow for any physical contact or incidents which may warrant additional suspension or discipline. The final decision to overrule an ejection is the sole responsibility of the District Commissioner after a review by the league commissioner, player representative, umpire assignor and U.I.C.
